World hunger on the rise again, reversing years of progress



According to the statement of FAO Director-General José Graziano da Silva at the opening of the agency's biennial conference (3-8 July), the number of hungry people in the world has increased since 2015, reversing years of progress. Climate change phenomenon and conflicts in places like northeast Nigeria Somalia, South Sudan, Nigeria and Yemen had worsened the global famine situation, with 20 million people severely affected. Strong political commitment and the translation of the pledges into action at national and local level are identified by Jose graziano de Silva as key issues to defeat hunger. Pormotion of sustainable agriculture along with mitigation and adaptation to climate change, poverty reduction, water scarcity, migration and support for rural populations affected by conflicts will be among the priorities of FAO for the next two years.
